OBJECTIVE

To provide the City Council with an update regarding the Garden Grove Police Department Infrastructure Space Needs Assessment and next steps.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

In November 2018, Garden Grove residents voted and approved the passage of Measure O, a one-percent sales tax increase that would generate additional revenues for city services. Specifically focused on public safety needs, Public Safety infrastructure upgrades were identified as one of the top priorities for the use of Measure O funds. As a result, on February 22, 2019, City staff issued an RFP to identify an architectural firm that could provide consulting services for the Garden Grove Police Department's aging infrastructure. The RFP called for the selected firm to conduct a space needs assessment that would ultimately provide City staff with an analysis of the condition of the existing facility, the necessary space required for a department our size, as well as the potential for future growth. On July 9, 2020, the City Council authorized staff to enter into an agreement with Dewberry Architects Inc. Over the next several months, Dewberry surveyed GGPD staff and conducted numerous site visits in order to gather the information and data necessary to prepare a comprehensive needs assessment report.

On January 28, 2020, Dewberry presented the findings of its space needs assessment to the City Council, clearly conveying the need for additional space and improvement at GGPD's existing facility. Expansion and improvement of the facility would not only enable the department to function more effectively and efficiently, but also position the department for future growth.

Recently, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the City has experienced negative financial impacts that have delayed progress related to public safety infrastructure upgrades. Nevertheless, the City is still focused on the need to improve the City's Police facilities and intends to prioritize the project as soon as the financial impact of COVID-19 is more fully understood. As the City prepares for its FY 2021-22 and FY

2022-23 Biennial Budget, staff will monitor and update revenue and expenditure projections and analyze potential long-term financing strategies that may be implemented to upgrade the Police Department headquarters. Staff will continue to provide regular financial and progress updates to the City Council.

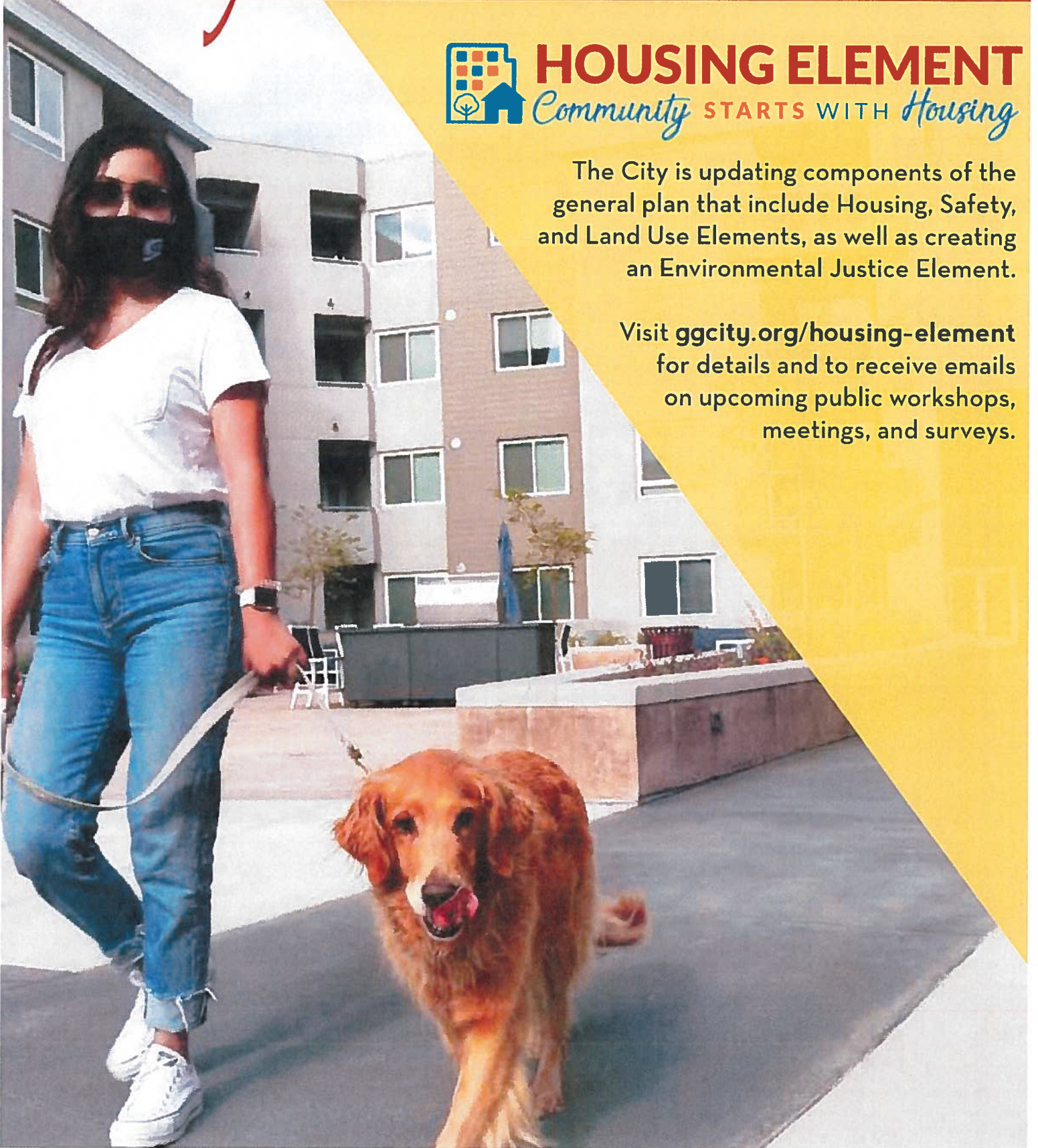

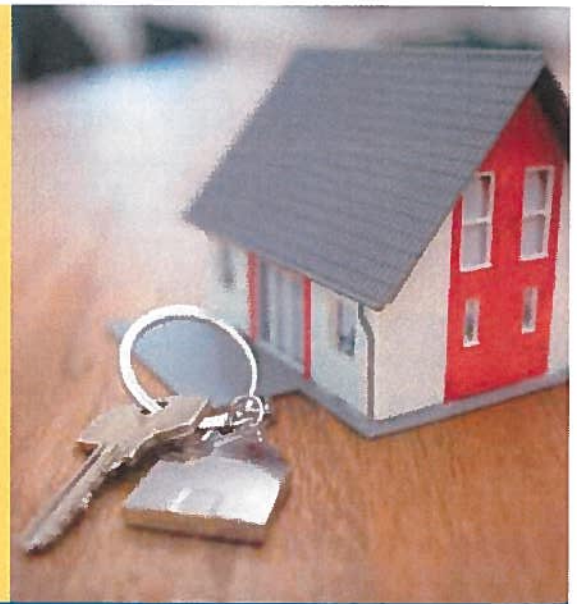




CITY OF GARDEN GROVE OFFERING *First-Time Home Buyer Program*

OC Animal Care's Fur-ever Family Event to feature Low-Cost Adoptions

TUSTIN, Calif. (September 1, 2020) – OC Animal Care will host the Fur-ever Family event aimed at assisting pet lovers in the community with a pet food giveaway and low-cost adoptions sponsored by Fourth District Supervisor Doug Chaffee of the Orange County Board of Supervisors.

On September 12, OC Animal Care social media platforms will highlight adoptable pets. Families ready to adopt will have the opportunity to virtually sign up for one of one-hundred low-cost adoption vouchers sponsored by Supervisor Chaffee. Vouchers are first-come, first-serve and are limited to one per household for up to one hundred vouchers.

"We support companionship and positive mental health and what better way than to do that while also connecting homeless pets with new families." said Supervisor Doug Chaffee, Fourth District. "We know pets lower anxiety and stress as well as promote healthy habits for people of all ages."

The event will also feature the contactless Family Fur-st Drive Thru Pet Pantry where Supervisor Chaffee and staff will work alongside volunteers to distribute pet food to families in need from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. or while supplies last. This will be the fourth pet food pantry hosted by OC Animal Care in conjunction with community partners Animal Assistance League of Orange County, SoCal Animal Response Team, and The Shamrock Rescue Foundation. To date, the pet food pantry has given out over 7,000 pounds of food to help feed more than 550 pets in Orange County.

"We truly appreciate Supervisor Chaffee for supporting our mission and helping all the pet lovers in the community." added OC Animal Care Interim Director Andi Bernard. "We hope families join us virtually as we feature pets onsite and in foster homes who are waiting for their perfect match."

To sign up for a low-cost adoption voucher, adopters need to submit an online form on the OC Animal Care website starting at 8 a.m. on the day of the event. The first one hundred families will receive an email confirmation with a voucher and have 30 days to make an appointment and adopt their new pet.

Preparation work for track installation is ongoing in Segment 2. Preparation work requires full lane and parking closures on Santa Ana Boulevard from Raitt Street to Shelton Street.

- Full closure of the north side of Santa Ana Boulevard
- Full parking closure along the north side of Santa Ana Boulevard
- Shift of a single lane of eastbound traffic to the south side of Santa Ana Boulevard
- Westbound traffic is detoured north or south starting at Bristol Street

Foundation installation for the poles necessary to carry the overhead wiring of the OC Streetcar will continue along the streetcar route

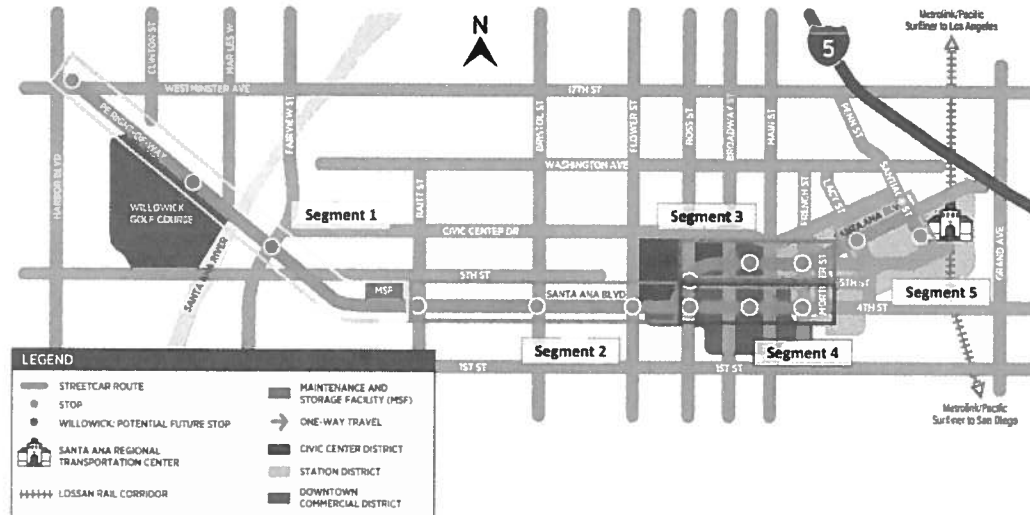
- Construction activities include excavation, trenching, concrete pours and road work and restoration
- Tree trimming and tree removals may be necessary along the streetcar route. Crews will follow all necessary guidelines for monitoring possible bird nesting's with an arborist
- Temporary parking and lane closures may be in place

Water pipeline and storm drain work will continue along the streetcar route

- Construction activities include excavation, trenching, installation of water pipelines and storm drains, and road work and restoration
- Temporary parking and lane restrictions may be in place

Access will be maintained for all residents and businesses. Construction activities are dependent on weather and resource availability.

SEGMENT 1 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Intersection of Harbor Blvd. and Westminster Ave. to Raitt St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 1 construction activities will include:

- Preliminary work at the site of the future Maintenance Storage Facility
- Storm drain installation within the PEROW
- Water pipeline installation and testing at the PEROW and Fairview Street
- Santa Ana River Bridge construction
- Westminster Avenue Bridge construction

Storm drain installation and water pipeline work will require temporary detours as well as lane closures at Fairview Street near the PEROW.

SEGMENT 2 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Raitt St. to Parton St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 2 construction activities will include:

- Preparation for track installation on W. Santa Ana Boulevard from Raitt Street to Bristol Street
- Storm drain installation on W. Santa Ana Boulevard and Bristol Street

Preparation work for track installation will require a full closure of the north side of W. Santa Ana Boulevard, eastbound traffic will be shifted to the south side of W. Santa Ana Boulevard. Westbound traffic will be detoured north or south at Bristol Street. Additionally, a parking closure on the north side of W. Santa Ana Boulevard will be in place.

SEGMENT 3 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Ross St. to Mortimer St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 3 construction activities will include:

- Storm drain installation on Broadway, from 3rd Street to W. Santa Ana Boulevard
- Storm drain installation at the intersection of Main Street and W. Santa Ana Boulevard

Storm drain installation will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures on Broadway, W. Santa Ana Boulevard and Main Street.

SEGMENT 4 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES

Ross St. to Mortimer St.

Over the next two weeks, Segment 4 construction activities will include:

- Manhole installation on Sycamore Street and 5th Street
- CCTV inspection of storm drains on Sycamore Street, Broadway, Spurgeon Street and at the intersection of Mortimer Street and 4th Street

Manhole installation and CCTV inspections will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures on Sycamore Street, 5th Street, Broadway, Spurgeon and at the intersection of W. Santa Ana Boulevard and Main Street.

SEGMENT 5 CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES Mortimer St. to SARTC

Over the next two weeks, Segment 5 construction activities will include:

- Fire service installation and testing along E. Santa Ana Boulevard at Minter Street and Garfield Street
- Water pipeline installation on E. Santa Ana Boulevard and Santiago Street

Water pipeline and fire service installation will require temporary detours as well as lane and parking closures on E. Santa Ana Boulevard and Santiago Street.

Safety of the crews and community is our top priority. Please slow down near work sites and follow pedestrian instructions.

About the Project

OC Streetcar is the first modern streetcar project to be built in Orange County and will serve Santa Ana's historic and thriving downtown, which includes federal, state and local courthouses, government offices, colleges, an artists' village and a thriving restaurant scene. Expected to begin carrying passengers in 2022, it will operate along a 4.15-mile route that connects the Santa Ana Regional Transportation Center (SARTC) and a new transit hub at Harbor Boulevard and Westminster Avenue in Garden Grove.

Larger when they come into contact with people who are wearing masks in public including hospitals, clinics, restaurants, businesses, and everywhere else.

Wearing masks is necessary to protect yourself and others to slow the spread of COVID-19, but are not conducive and create barriers for communication with DHH people. This notice will provide tips for enhancing communication between the hearing and DHH communities while mask coverings are necessary.

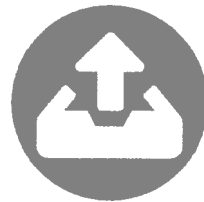
Challenges DHH people are faced with during COVID-19:

- X Lip-reading made impossible by wearing masks.
- X Most masks do not have clear openings for seeing mouth movement.
- X Chasing jets or pencils is a high risk when wearing notes.
- X Lack of training for health care and other workers regarding communication needs of DHH.
- X Social distancing measures make it difficult to interact and meet the way DHH people can communicate.
- X Shortages of in person sign language interpreters during the COVID 19 pandemic.

Tips for effective communication with DHH persons:

- ✓ Remove your mask for a few minutes to allow the DHH person to read your lips. If you are uncomfortable with removing your mask, you can use your gestures, body movement or any visual aids to help the DHH person to understand.
- ✓ The clear mask is the best method to communicate with a DHH person.

CARES Act Dollars - Guidance by CA Dept. of Finance on Reporting and Web Portal

Held Friday, Aug. 28, this webinar covered information related to the California State Budget for FY 2020-21, authorizing the Department of Finance to allocate \$500 million to cities to address the public health and public safety impacts of COVID-19. Recipient cities are required to submit their reports to the Department of Finance no later than 11:59 P.M. on Sept. 4. Attendees were provided a walkthrough of the state's reporting requirements, new web portal, and participated in a question and answer session.

League Urges Cities to Take Action on Priority Bills on Governor's Desk

Now is the time for cities to send signature and veto requests to the Governor

September 2, 2020

The Legislature wrapped up its 2020 legislative year with a drama-filled session ending around 1:30 a.m. Tuesday, Sept. 1.

The final day of official business was marked with numerous caucuses, delays, and infighting between leadership in the Senate and the Assembly. Several high profile bills failed to advance to the Governor's desk simply because the Legislature ran out of time, as they faced a constitutional deadline of midnight on Aug. 31.

Gov. Gavin Newsom must now decide whether to sign or veto the hundreds of bills on his desk by midnight on Sept. 30. This year, the League submitted nine requests for signatures and five requests for vetoes. The number of requests are fewer when compared to recent years, as result of the more than one thousand bills that the Legislature culled due to the COVID-19 public health crisis and the abbreviated legislative schedule. By the end of February, nearly 2,700 bills and resolutions were introduced. In the final weeks of the legislative session, approximately 500 measures remained.

The most notable bills for which the League is requesting a veto pertain to workers compensation. SB 1383 (Jackson) would require any employer, public or private, with 5 or more employees to provide 12 weeks of protected leave each year and threatens employers with litigation for any unintentional mistake. SB 1383 is not limited in scope to COVID-19 and would place a significant burden on employers at a time when they can least afford it.

The League is also requesting that the Governor veto AB 685 (Reyes), which would create an onerous and comprehensive set of reporting requirements for all California employers when an employee is exposed to COVID-19. While it is certainly a valid concern to ensure our public sector workforce is notified of potential COVID-19 exposure, this measure would set an incredibly aggressive timeline for notification, create compliance challenges through the use of ambiguous thresholds, and establish penalties per violation.

The League is encouraging the Governor to sign several key measures including SB 1441 (McGuire), which would extend until Jan. 1, 2026 the Local Prepaid Mobile Telephony Services Collections Act. This important tool supports local governments' ability to collect much needed Utility User Taxes from retail sales of prepaid wireless telecommunication products and services.

AB 1286 (Muratsuchi) is also an important bill the League requests the Governor to sign. This bill would require shared mobility device providers to obtain a permit or agreement with the city or county in which it seeks to operate and comply with all local operation, parking, maintenance, and safety rules. Additionally, this measure would require shared mobility device providers to maintain minimum commercial general liability insurance.

The following is a list of bills in which the League is urging the Governor to sign or veto.

Request for Signature

SB 865 (Hill) Excavations. Subsurface Installations.

This measure would strengthen safe excavation practices by increasing collaboration between excavators and operators, requiring data sharing amongst key stakeholders, and moving the Dig Safe Board to the Office of Energy Infrastructure Safety.

SB 970 (Umberg) Primary Election Date.

This measure would change the date of the statewide direct primary to the first Tuesday after the first Monday in June in even-numbered years in which there is no presidential primary.

SB 1044 (Allen) Firefighting Equipment And Foam. PFAS Chemicals.

This measure would prohibit the manufacture, sale, distribution, and use of class B firefighting foam containing per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS chemicals) by January 1, 2022. Would also require notification of the presence of PFAS in the protective equipment of firefighters.

SB 1441 (McGuire) Local Prepaid Mobile Telephony Services Collection Act.

This measure would extend until January 1, 2026 the Local Prepaid Mobile Telephony Services Collections Act. This Act would support local governments' ability to collect Utility User Taxes (UUTs) from retail sales of prepaid wireless telecommunication products and services and would assist the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) with administration of the program.

AB 434 (Daly) Housing Financing Programs. Uniform Procedures.

This measure would align six rental housing programs with the Multifamily Housing Program (MHP), to enable the state Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) to implement a single application and scoring system for making awards under all seven programs, starting on Jan. 1, 2022.

AB 992 (Mullin) Local Agencies. Social Media.

This measure would update the Brown Act to clarify that correspondences between local elected officials and their constituents via social media is permitted.

AB 1286 (Muratsuchi) Shared Mobility Devices. Agreements.

This measure would require shared mobility device providers to obtain a permit or agreement with the city or county it seeks to operate in and comply with all local operation, parking, maintenance, and safety rules. Additionally, this measure would require shared mobility device providers to maintain minimum commercial general liability insurance.

AB 1775 (Jones-Sawyer) False Reports and Harassment.

This measure would make it a misdemeanor to knowingly use the 911 system to harass another person based on a perceived characteristic of a protected class. This measure would also allow for civil action against persons who make false police reports or claims, regardless of discriminatory motive, and classifies blatantly false reports to law enforcement as a form of intimidation.

AB 2617 (Gabriel) Firearms. Gun Violence Restraining Orders.

This measure would make it an offense to possess a firearm in violation of a protective order issued by another state. Any violation of this provision would result in a five year ban on purchasing or possessing firearms or ammunition.

Request for Veto

SB 1159 (Hill) Workers' Compensation. COVID-19. Critical Workers.

This measure would (1) require a study to be done on the impact COVID-19 claims have had on the workers' compensation system; (2) codify the Governor's executive order on workers' compensation; (3) create a rebuttable presumption for public safety and healthcare workers who contract COVID-19; and (4) create a cluster based approach to outbreaks of COVID-19 for workers' compensation purposes.

SB 1383 (Jackson) Unlawful Employment Practice. Family Leave.

This measure would require any employer with five or more employees to provide 12 weeks of job protected leave to run concurrently with the Family Medical and Leave Act (FMLA). It would make

it an unlawful employment practice to interfere with the exercise of this leave.

AB 685 (Reyes) COVID-19 Exposure Notification.

This measure would require employers to provide notice within one business day to all qualified employees if they or an exclusive employee representative is notified of an exposure to COVID-19.

AB 1947 (Kalra) Employment Violation Complaints. Requirements. Time.

This measure would authorize the courts to award one-sided attorney fees to a plaintiff who brings a successful action for a violation of Labor Code Section 1102.5 (whistleblower protections).

AB 2967 (O'Donnell) Public Employees' Retirement System. Contracting Agencies. Exclusion from Membership.

This measure would prohibit agencies from excluding CalPERS membership to any class of employee through the contract amendment process.

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League Weekly COVID-19 Update: Aug. 27-Sept. 2

September 2, 2020

The Department of Finance (DOF) launched their [Coronavirus Relief Fund \(CRF\) Web Portal](#) and updated resources related to CARES Act funding reporting for cities.

Cities can access the web portal, an updated Frequently Asked Questions document, and a User Guide from the [DOF webpage for COVID-19 Information](#).

The League hosted a webinar Aug. 28 with DOF to walk cities through the new web portal. For cities who were not able to participate, the webinar [slides](#) and [recording](#) are available for review. The League has also provided a more [city-specific FAQ](#) for cities to reference.

Gov. Gavin Newsom signed statewide [COVID-19 tenant and landlord legislation](#), and [announced a new statewide framework](#) to reopen California's economy. This [new framework](#) has four tiers which are determined by the number of cases per 100,000 residents and the percentage of COVID-19 tests that come back positive. The Governor also signed legislation to help with evictions and also signed an [executive order](#) to increase testing capacity.
